Ashley Navarro, a Ph.D. candidate, holds a bachelor's degree in Psychology from Complutense University of Madrid. She also holds a master's degree in psychological assessment and treatment and a master's in General Health Psychology, both from Complutense University of Madrid. She is currently pursuing a master's degree in Methodology of Behavioral and Health Sciences from UNED, UCM, and UAM.

She is currently a professor at European University of Madrid and Antonio de Nebrija University. Ashley is a member of the Personality and Clinical Psychology lab at Complutense University of Madrid, where she is part of research teams such as Psychological Assistance to Terrorism Victims and Other Victims of Catastrophic Events, and Mental Health and Stigma in the Classroom: Forum Theatre as a Means of Intervention to Promote Dialogue and Support Among University Students.

Ashley also worked as a psychologist during the COVID-19 lockdown for a psychological hotline set up by the Spanish Ministry of Health to assist those who required help due to the pandemic. She has also participated in several national and international scientific congresses of psychology, contributing to the dissemination of applied psychology knowledge.

Ashley has collaborated with the IAAP Task Force on Terrorism and Peacebuilding since 2019 and is currently the Coordinator of said Task Force, helping develop international research on psychology's contributions to terrorism studies.

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
