Sara Escudero is a Psychologist at the Spanish Association of Victims of Terrorism (AVT), from the National High Court in Madrid. Sara holds three Official Masters degrees: in Psychopharmacology and Drug Abuse, in General Health Psychology, and in Clinical Psychology, all of them coursed at the Complutense University of Madrid (UCM). She has also completed the 4th edition of the “Comprehensive Assistance to Victims of Terrorism” Diploma organised by the Spanish Association of Victims of Terrorism (AVT) and the UCM. She has also been a scholarship holder at the UCM Psychology clinic. Sara has taken part in the elaboration of protocols focused on the evaluation and intervention of victims of terrorism, as well as being implicated in the I+D+I project “psychological Follow-up of Victims of Terrorism and Effectiveness of Psychological Treatments”. She has published the article “Videoconference-delivered psychological treatment for a victim of terrorism with posttraumatic stress disorder and other comorbid emotional disorders 30 years after the terrorist attack”, and has also taken part in the making of several posters that have been presented at international Psychology conferences. Sara has collaborated as a professor in the “Comprehensive Assistance to Victims of Terrorism” Diploma, and has also cooperated with trainee students from the Masters in Victimology at the UCM.

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
