Clara Gesteira, Ph.D., is an assistant professor of Clinical Psychology at European University of Madrid and Complutense University of Madrid. She has conducted research on the study of psychological interventions for victims of terrorism in Spain. She wrote her doctoral dissertation on the efficacy of this sort of interventions, obtaining the School of Psychologists of Madrid “Rafael Burgaleta” Award and the Extraordinary Doctoral Award of Complutense University.

She is co-author of more than 20 publications focused on trauma, victims of terrorism or victims of other kinds of violence. She has directly participated in the “European Platform for Assisting Victims of Terrorism-EPAVT”, funded by the European Commission of the European Union. As a part of the Advanced Research Seminar Training Seminar (ARTS), organized by the International Association of Applied Psychology (IAAP) and the International Union of Psychological Science (IUPsyS), she is leading an international research project on myths on trauma and victims of catastrophes that general population of different cultures can develop.

She undertook two international research stays, working directly with young refugees at the Center d'Observation et d'Orientation pour Mineurs Étrangers Non Accompagnés-FEDASIL (Brussels) and with victims of the armed conflict in Colombia, in this occasion in collaboration with the Center for Disaster & Extreme Event Preparedness of Miami.

She is member of the Spanish National Network for the assistance of victims of terrorism and consultant for the “European Network for Psychosocial Management-EUNAD” and for the IAAP Task Force on Terrorism.
