


Task Force on Terrorism



JOCELYN J. BÉLANGER, PH.D. PROF. CONSULTANT

Jocelyn J. Bélanger is a professor of psychology at New York University Abu Dhabi. He earned his master's degree and doctorate in Social Psychology from the University of Maryland, College Park. His research focuses on human judgment, motivation, and the psychology of terrorism.

Dr. Bélanger is the author of over 45 peer-reviewed publications including a book with Oxford University Press entitled: "The Three Pillars of Radicalization: Needs, Narratives, and Networks."

In March 2015, he was appointed by the City of Montreal to create the first deradicalization center in North America to tackle homegrown terrorism: The Centre for the Prevention of Radicalization Leading to Violence (CPRLV). Dr. Bélanger's recommendations led to many concrete measures to prevent violent extremism including training sessions for frontline workers (e.g., teachers, social workers), as well as the creation of a helpline that offers free and confidential listening, evaluation and counseling services.

Dr. Bélanger is the recipient of several awards such as the APA Dissertation Research Award and the Guy Bégin Award for the Best Research Paper in Social Psychology. His research is funded by the Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada, the US Department of Homeland Security, as well as Public Safety Canada.
