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Noelia Moran, PhD, is an Associate Professor of Clinical Psychology at Complutense University of Madrid (Spain). Her research focuses on psychopathological consequences of terrorist attacks, the explicit and implicit attitudes and beliefs and dysfunctional cognitive vulnerability to PTSD, and the psychological CBT treatment of victims of terrorist attacks. She was a researcher of the European Platform to Assist Victims of Terrorism (EPAVT) funded by the European Union. Professor Moran also conducts research on battered parents, also known as child to parent violence. She has several contributions on these topics in scientific congresses, conferences, articles, chapters, and books.

Professor Moran serves as a consultant on the IAAP Task Force on Global Terrorism, and she is on the executive committee of the International Association of Applied Psychology Division 6: Clinical and Community Psychology. She is also the secretary of the Sociedad Española para el avance de la Psicología Clínica y de la Salud (SEPCyS) and a member of the Spanish national victims of terrorism psychological care network

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
