Pedro Altungy holds a bachelor's degree in Psychology from the Complutense University of Madrid (UCM), where he currently is working toward his PhD in clinical psychology. He also holds master's degrees in the field of psychological assessment and treatment (Master in Evidence-Based Clinical Psychology and Master in General Health Psychology.) He helped develop the 4th edition of the "Comprehensive Assistance to Victims of Terrorism" diploma, organised by the Spanish Association of Victims of Terrorism (AVT) and the UCM. In addition, he completed a diploma in "Psychological Intervention in Natural Disasters and Catastrophes: Tsunamis" organised by the Spanish Military Emergency Unit (UME).

Since 2014, Pedro has worked in the Psychological Clinical Treatment research team at UCM. The team's work focuses on providing comprehensive assistance to victims of terrorism. Pedro has participated in several projects funded with I+D budgets. He has given lectures at a number of national and international psychology congresses. Currently, Pedro works in the private sector as well as being an active researcher at the Personality, Assessment and Clinical Psychology Department of the UCM Psychology School. Pedro also is a member of the Spanish National Network of Terrorism Victims Assistance of the Spanish Interior Ministry. Since 2014, he has been a member of the International Association of Applied Psychology (IAAP) and served as an editor for the IAAP Division 6 website and newsletter. Since 2018, Pedro has been president of IAAP Division 15 and the community manager of the IAAP social media.
