Roberto Navarro holds a bachelor's degree in psychology from the Complutense University of Madrid (UCM), where he's currently working toward his PhD in clinical psychology. He completed the 4th edition of the "Comprehensive Assistance to Victims of Terrorism" diploma, organised by the Spanish Association of Victims of Terrorism (AVT) and the UCM. Subsequently, he helped develop and teach the 6th and 7th editions of the diploma program. In addition, he has completed a diploma in "Psychological Intervention in Natural Disasters and Catastrophes: Tsunamis" organised by the Spanish Military Emergency Unit (UME).

Since 2013, Roberto has worked in the Psychological Clinical Treatment research team at the UCM. The team's work focuses on comprehensive assistance for victims of terrorism.
