





ROCÍO FAUSOR PHD. CANDIDATE MEMBER, Coordinator

Rocío Fausor is a Ph.D. candidate at Complutense University of Madrid (UCM). She has completed master's degrees in psychological assessment and treatment (MA in Clinical and Health Psychology and a specific MA in Psychology to work with patients) at UCM. She has also completed diplomas in emergency and terrorism response, including "Psychological Intervention in Natural Disasters and Catastrophes: Tsunamis" and the 1st edition of the "Comprehensive Assistance to Victims of Terrorism." She has been recruited to serve as a professor for the "Comprehensive Assistance to Victims of Terrorism" program from the 4th to 7th (most recent) editions.

Rocio currently conducts research in the Personality, Assessment and Clinical Psychology Department of the UCM Psychology School. She has participated in several projects funded with I+D budgets, and she has given lectures at several national and international psychology congresses. Since 2012, Rocío has been collaborating with the Psychological Clinical Treatment research team at the UCM. The team's work focuses on comprehensive assistance for victims of terrorism. It is in this area that she is focusing her doctoral work. Her research focuses on "depressive dysfunctional attitudes and Posttraumatic Growth in victims on terrorism".

Rocío is member of the Spanish National Network for the assistance of victims of terrorism. She also serves as a supply psychologist, providing information and other assistance through the Terrorism Victims Office of the Spanish National Audience. Since 2012, she has been a member of the International Association of Applied Psychology (IAAP). She starting collaborating with Division 6 (Clinical and Community Psychology) including editing the Division 6 webpage. She also authored two articles for this newsletter, and she edited the latest issues.

In 2018, Rocio was named coordinator of the IAAP Task Force on Terrorism and Peace Building. Since then, she has been coordinating all task force members' and collaborators' teamwork, and developing internal e-news, as well as managing and adding content to the Task Force webpage and Twitter account
