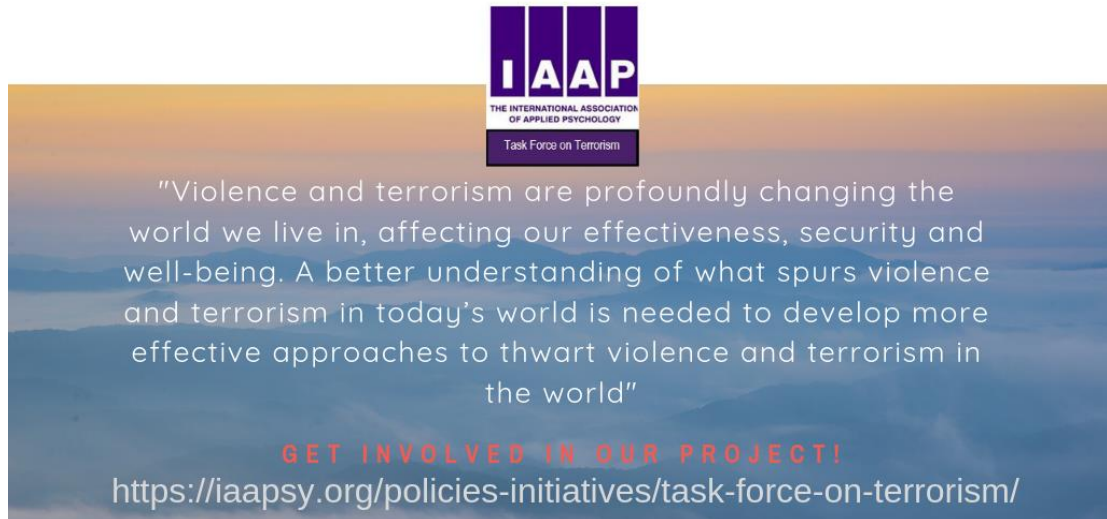


IAAP TASK FORCE ON TERRORISM AND PEACE BUILDING ACTIVITIES (May, 2019)
